We have received funding from Trust for London and we want to:

- raise the profile of Disabled People and our rights.
- give more local Disabled people the confidence and skills to be able to influence people who make decisions.
- remove barriers to local Disabled People being involved in the decision making themselves.

What the job is

You will recruit local Disabled people to be members of HAFAC.

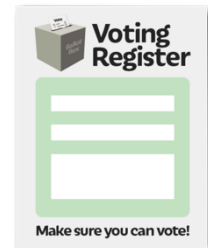


You will arrange training and mentoring for HAF CAC members. This will help them become effective campaigners

You will run campaigns that remove barriers for Disabled people. These include making it easier to register to vote and to vote in elections.

And getting more Disabled people involved in decision making locally.

You will help run the organisation and write reports to say how well we are doing.



How much we are paying

Rate of pay: £25,000 pro rata (actual pay is
£7143 per year)

Hours: 10 hrs / week

Responsible to: HAF CAC steering group

Period: Until November 2021



Office: We are currently based in North Kensington. We plan to move to an office in Hammersmith and Fulham in 2019

Who are we looking for

We need a Disabled person to do this work. This is because personal lived experience of the barriers we face is vital to doing the work.

You need to be able to get to Hammersmith and Fulham and to travel around during your work.



If you need support in order to do the job we can support you to make an application to Access to Work.

What to do if you are interested in this role:

Please tell us about the skills and experience that you have that means you can do this job. Write this down

and send it to us by post or in an email. Use up to two sides of A4 paper. You are welcome to apply for the role in a different way or in a different format - for example a video application.



In your application describe how you can do the job as we have set out in this document. Don't assume we know you - tell us about the skills you have. And tell us about any experience you have that shows you can do the job.

You are invited to get in touch to talk about the job before you apply. This is not part of the application. It is a chance to find out more about HAF CAC and ask questions you want to.
