## Have your say on a new political map of Barnet Council (5 March – 13 May)



The independent Local Government Boundary Commission for England is asking people across Barnet to comment on its draft proposals for new council ward boundaries that would mean **changes to all ward boundaries** in Barnet. The proposal is that Barnet should still have 63 councillors but representing 14 three-councillor wards, 10 two-councillor wards and 1 one-councillor ward across the council. ## New design of the Copthall Sports Hub Masterplan (5 April – 17 May)



Following feedback from a consultation last year, the Barnet Copthall Sports Hub design has been revised. The revision of the design still maintains the long-term vision for the site to provide traditional and non-traditional opportunities offering a range of benefits for residents. There are no proposed amendments to the adjoining Mill Hill Open Spaces masterplans.

#### **Brent Cross West Station Consultation (3 April – 1 June)**



The new Brent Cross West Thameslink Station is central to the Brent Cross Cricklewood regeneration programme. Forming part of a vibrant new town centre to deliver 7,500 new homes, 3million sq. ft. of work space, up to 27,000 new jobs, new and improved schools and health facilities. Following earlier public consultation, the Council now requires to submit a planning application for the train station and would like your

We are seeking your views on two Play Areas in the park: it is proposed that the Play Area near Long Lane will be designed as an older children's play area; and the proposed Play Area near the Café will be designed for toddlers and younger children.
