New Tier 2 rules: What do they mean for you and your business?

What changes can you expect as london moves to High risk (Tier 2) of Covid 19?

- You should not meet people indoors unless they are members of your household/support bubble
- you can still meet up to five other people outside while observing social distancing
- **Childcare bubble** for under 14 year olds an individual outside the child's immediate household can form a care bubble to help look after them.
- You should keep **travel to a minimum** and do not go to any area classed as very high (tier3).

Extension of the coronavirus business interruption loan schemes

The Government has extended their three Coronavirus business interruption loan schemes to the 30th November 2020. The <u>Coronavirus Business Interruption</u> <u>Loan Scheme</u> (CBILS), the <u>Coronavirus Large Business Interruption Loan</u> <u>Scheme</u> (CLBILS), the <u>Bounce Back Loan Scheme</u> (BBLS) have all been extended. The extension aligns all the end dates of the schemes, when previously they had different ending date.

Changes to the Job Support Scheme - To be

introduced from the 1st November

The <u>Job Support Scheme</u> will run for six months, covering staff working on reduced hours or staff working for businesses that have been legally required to close. Employers will pay the wages of staff for any hours worked, but where hours are reduced will receive 66.67% of their normal pay for the hours not worked, to a maximum of £3,125. Businesses will pay 5% of reference salary for the hours not worked, whilst the government will pay the remaining 61.67%. To be eligible employees must be working at least 20% of their normal hours.

Where employees are not working at all because their employer has been required to close as a result of coronavirus restrictions, employees will receive 2/3rds of their normal pay, fully funded by the government, to a maximum of £2,083.33 per month.

Employer incentives for hiring new apprentices go live

As part of the Government's Plan for Jobs, employers will receive £2,000 for each new apprentice aged under 25 they hire, and £1,500 for each new apprentice they hire aged 25 and over, up to the 31st January 2021. Any organisation can apply for the payment, no matter the size or the sector. <u>Find out more here.</u>

All applications submitted will be reviewed and assessed on a **first come, first served basis** and funding will be available until the £1m available has been allocated.

Eligible SMEs can access grants of between £1,000 – £5,000. To prepare, please see the checklist below:

- 1. Read the <u>Frequently Asked Questions</u> to check your eligibility and what the grant can fund
- 2. Check what information is required for the application

If you meet the requirements of the grant scheme, prepare and <u>submit</u> the information for your application

Up to £5,000 in match funding available through the Pay It Forward London crowdfunding platform

Through the Back to Business Fund, the £1m Back to Business Fund will match every pound raised by a business up to a maximum of £5,000 - or 50% of their campaign target. Find out more.
