Welcome

Welcome to our 9th Covid-19 bulletin, which in future will be issued monthly as, like us, I'm sure you all are inundated with emails and information related to Covid-19.

We are far from being out of the Coronavirus crisis as yet – as numbers increase across the capital, London enters Tier 2 restrictions from midnight, Friday 16th October. With winter just around the corner, seasonal flu is also being planned for – with flu vaccines being strongly encouraged, particularly for those with underlying health conditions and older people.

We have been impressed and humbled by the sheer hard work and commitment of the voluntary sector during the crisis. Services were up and running in a matter of days, and organisations have worked tirelessly to ensure their most vulnerable clients were safe and supported. Residents responded fantastically – hundreds of people volunteered through H&F Community Aid Network and through the many of Mutual Aid Groups which sprang up in response to the crisis. New services and organisations emerged, which began to deliver vital help and support to their neighbours. We can only hope that this neighbourly spirit and community action will last long beyond the Covid-19 crisis. If nothing else, the crisis offered us all the opportunity to learn and change our practices – some of these have brought overall improvements that organisations may well retain in the longer term, other changes are short term until we can return to something closer to normality.

Sobus has provided a range of information and resources to local groups, facilitated online meetings and continued to provide 1-2-1 support for groups and organisations throughout the crisis. We've undertaken a number of surveys to get a better understanding of the current and future needs of the sector so that we can deliver

the support that is needed. We will continue to encourage organisations to let us know what support is needed, and of course to celebrate and champion our individual and collective voices and successes. As always, we would love to hear from you – updates on your current service offers and any good news stories to share.

Rule of 6

It is illegal for more than six people from different households to meet indoors or outdoors in any social gathering

Support bubbles or an individual household which has more than six members can still meet. However, these groups cannot come into contact with other groups.

Schools and workplaces

The changes do not affect schools, workplaces or Covid-secure weddings or funerals. Organised team sports are also unaffected.

Enforcement

The police will be enforcing this and can issue fines of $\pounds 100$. People will be liable to a maximum of $\pounds 3,200$ for persistent breaches.

NHS information

Get a free NHS test to check if you have coronavirus

You can have a test (swab test) to check if you have coronavirus (COVID-19) now.

Who can get a test

Only get a test if you have coronavirus symptoms or have been asked to get tested. This will help make sure people who need a test can get one.

You can get a free NHS test if:

- you have any <u>symptoms of coronavirus</u> (a high temperature, a new, continuous cough or a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste)
- you're getting a test for someone you live with who has symptoms
- your local council asks you to get a test
- you're taking part in a government pilot project

NHS Wellbeing Webinars

Healthy London Partnership's <u>Coping Well During Covid</u> webinars are developed specifically to support anyone feeling anxious about coronavirus and how it is impacting them, their loved ones or their work. Each 60-minute webinar is led and delivered in a clinically led way by Emily Gardner, Cognitive Behavioural Therapist, East London NHS Foundation Trust.

Additional guidance on mental health and wellbeing

As part of ThriveLDN's coordination role, they are producing <u>additional guidance</u> on the mental health and wellbeing aspects of coronavirus (COVID-19) for London. Colleagues within the Thrive LDN team are currently updating this, considering both forthcoming Tier 2 measures but also taking into account early findings from community insights work. We expect to be able to share this with you early next week.

Annual General Meetings

AGMs and other meetings: postponing or cancelling meetings

Coronavirus continues to have a major impact on charity events and trustees need to consider how and if they can hold meetings.

Charitable companies and Charitable Incorporated Organisations (CIOs) can hold AGMs and other members' <u>meetings online</u> - this has been made possible by the Corporate Insolvency and Governance Act 2020 and applies until 30 December. For other types of meetings, or for any other type of charity, trustees need to check if their charity's governing document allows them to hold <u>meetings online or by</u> <u>telephone</u>. Where it does not, an alternative may be to amend it to allow meetings to be held in this way.

We recognise that for some charities virtual meetings are not a viable solution, nor are socially distanced face-to-face meetings. In such instances trustees may consider they have no choice but to cancel or postpone their AGMs and other critical meetings.
