

Cases in Hammersmith and Fulham

392 new people had a confirmed positive test result reported on 4 January 2022.

Between 29 December 2021 and 4 January 2022, **3,156** people had a confirmed positive test result.

This shows a decrease of -19.9% compared to the previous 7 days.

Overall a mixed message.. Vaccination rates remain low, whilst hospital admissions are rising albeit slowly. The numbers of seriously ill patients in our hospitals remains low and although death rates are rising they remain low compared to the same period last year.

It is clear that we are not yet in the bright sunshine of a post pandemic period and there is still much to be done to get everyone vaccinated/.

So in the short term, stay cautious and keep your contacts to sensible levels, wear your mask and stay safe.
